Lake Level



Fish Cribs

LGIA purchases fish cribs and positions them around the lake to improve fish habitat. Most of the fish cribs are in depths of 15 to 20 feet, where the breakline is located. The majority are on the West Shore. To date, there are four requests from area residents for additional cribs to be built before winter 2022.
